

Have Extra-Terrestrials Visited White Lake?

New evidence uncovered in White Lake suggests that creatures from other worlds once visited White Lake. While on a pleasant float plane flight several years ago one of us (CG) photographed strange circles submerged in the shallows of White Lake (shown below).
